for £11. In 1842 the present clock, which has a 4ft copper dial, was given to the Church. Over the coming months the clock will be automated, including a regulator that should ensure accuracy and adjustment for Summer Time.

Once a faculty has been given (a sort of planning permission for churches) the work will be carried out by the Cumbria Clock Company who are currently working on 'Big Ben'!

Laleham Churchyard

aleham Churchyard is a L lovely area at the heart of the village, and the many tended plots are a testimony to love and special memories.

There are rules for tending the churchyard which reflect three quiding principles:

- To maintain a dignified environment that can be appreciated by all
- To ensure the safety and care of the churchyard
- To follow the rules set down by the Diocese of London

The full wording of the Churchyard Policy, which has been updated, is in the Church porch or available from the Church Office.

The policy includes:

Flowers

On cremated remains plots only cut flowers or small potted plants are permitted, which may be placed on the gravestone, or in a vase integrated into the gravestone. Artificial flowers are not permitted, with the exception of Remembrance Day poppies and Christmas

Given the limitations of space, shrubs may not be planted.

On burial plots with a grass surface the grass should be left to allow for mowing.

Individuality

Unfortunately the introduction of any additional objects, such as model angels or birds, lights or chimes, are not authorised.



We will shortly be removing items from the churchyard which do not conform to the Churchyard Policy. All items removed will be labelled with the family name where possible, and carefully stored for 3 months. Families can collect the items if they wish. Please contact the Church Office to arrange collections.



They meet material needs by providing food, clothing and accommodation, and offering support by befriending and caring for people in need. It is done in Jesus' name, bringing love and hope to those who often feel the world has given
