St. Nicholas was a Bishop who lived in the fourth century in a place called Myra in Asia Minor (modern day Turkey).

His parents died when he was young, leaving him very wealthy. But he was also a very kind man and had a reputation for helping the poor and giving secret gifts to people who needed it. There are several legends about St. Nicholas, although we don't know if any of them are true!

The most famous story about St. Nicholas tells how he secretly helped a poor man's family by dropping a bag of gold down the chimney, which fell into a stocking that had been hung by the fire to dry! This is where we get the

tradition of Christmas stockings from. The original Dutch settlers in America spelled St Nicholas 'Sinter Nikolaas', which gradually changed to 'Sinterklass'. For English colonists this became 'Santa Claus'. The modern image of Santa Cl

derives from a 19th century poem 'Ar account of a Visit from St Nicholas, more famously known as 'Twas the Night before Christmas'. It describes St. Nicholas with eight reindeer and as a jolly red-cheeked man.

Christians believe that God's gift to us at Christmas is worth far more than gold. Why not come to a service over Christmas to find out what this gift could mean for you?

Oh! You better watch out, You better not crv. You better not pout, I'm telling you why: Santa Claus is coming to town!

He's making a list, He's checking it twice, He's gonna find out who's naughty or nice. Santa Claus is coming to town!

He sees you when you're sleeping, He knows when you're awake. He knows when you've been bad or good, So be good for goodness sake!



So, at Christmas children are often told, "You need to be good if you want Santa to fill your stocking." And people may wonder if it's the same with God that we've got to achieve a certain level of goodness before he'll visit us with his blessing.

The Christmas message reveals that Jesus is kinder than Santa. Jesus said:

"I have not come to call respectable people to repent, but sinners." Jesus offers hope to bad people who

repent, not just good people.

And while Santa turns up one night a year. |esus says:

We may not be able to see him, but he is always ready to hear our prayers and to help us in the way that's best for us.

A short new book by Bishop Graham, our Area Bishop of Kensington, is being published on 21st November.

The publisher writes: 'The referendum may have rent the country asunder like no other issue in recent memory, but there are significant resonances with events in the past. Almost 500 years ago, in a sixteenthcentury version of Article 50, Britain made a break from Europe, declaring the King – rather than the Pope – Supreme Head of the English Church.

The split did not end the story. In the turmoil that followed, 'fake news' spread, families were divided and

However, an attempt was made to find a peaceable solution. In this brief but powerful book, Graham Tomlin draws on that history to remind us of the age-old political and spiritual task of harmonizing past and future, identity and openness, the local and the universal. The events of the last three years have shown how polarization can affect even those who are naturally generous and accommodating; the challenge of rising above division, of loving our neighbours - and even our enemies has never been greater for us all.

What's in a name?

What are we calling our babies? According to the Office for National Statistics in 2018:

Oliver and Olivia remained the most popular names in England and Wales. Arthur was the only new entry into the top 10 names for boys in 2018, replacing Jacob. Sophia and Grace replaced Poppy and Lily in the top 10 names for girls.

Most of us think long and hard over the names we give our children. Sometimes we pick a family name, a name of a celebrity or look to TV series for our inspiration. Most often we just choose a name we like the sound of.

When Joseph and Mary came to naming their first child the choice was easy. They were told what they should call him.

An angel of the Lord appeared to Joseph in a dream and said ".....you are to give him the name lesus."

lesus was a common name at the time. And it remains a popular name today – number 17 in the 2018 list. Not 'lesus', but in the original Hebrew it would be 'Yeshua' which is usually translated Joshua.

And they were also given God's reason for the choice of the name: "because he will save his people from their sins."

Jesus/Joshua means 'saves'. The baby at Christmas was given a name with a meaning, to show what his life's work would be. He had come on a mission to save us from everything that spoils and separates – that damages and divides. Its why his birth was greeted by the angels with the greeting 'Peace on earth'
